#### **Northern California**

Sacramento County Small Business and Nonprofit Grant Program (Sacramento County Only)



**What is it:** Sacramento County received funding from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) to support economic response and recovery efforts as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The intent of the Small Business & Nonprofit Grant Program is to provide relief to small business and nonprofit organizations that have been negatively impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and related health and safety restrictions.

**How much is available:** Eligible applicants may qualify for grants of \$10,000 each in one-time direct financial assistance. This is a grant program, not a loan, so funds will not need to be paid back.

**Application period:** July 5 through August 31, 2022.

**Deadline:** Apply by August 31, 2022, at 5 p.m. PST. Apply through the sac4smallbiz.org website.

#### **Southern California**

Black Business Owners and Entrepreneurs Apply Now for the Back in the Black Tour and a Chance to Win \$10,000



What is it: The <u>Black Innovation Alliance (BIA)</u> has joined forces with Google to offer the <u>Back In The Black Tour</u>, a joint effort to highlight the power of technology to help Black-owned businesses scale.

The BIA will host town halls in four cities (Macon, GA, Twin Cities, MN, San Diego, CA, and Philadelphia, PA) to highlight business owners who have leveraged technology to survive and thrive through the COVID-19 pandemic. The town halls will also provide local entrepreneurs with tactical strategies to activate key platforms, products, and online tools to take their business to the next level, build generational wealth, and spur economic development.

**How much is available:** There will be four winners from each of the four town hall cities (Philadelphia, Macon, Twin Cities, San Diego). Each winner will

receive \$10,000 and will be invited to share their story at their city's town hall.

In addition, there will be one national winner to receive \$10,000 and will be invited to share their story on BIA's social media platforms.

## Los Angeles County Making Big Moves to Support Small Business







On July 21<sup>st</sup>, Amber Tarrac, CalOSBA Southern California Local Engagement Specialist went to Los Angeles to celebrate with Los Angeles County officials and team members the launch of the county's Department of Economic Opportunity.

At the event, over 60 attendees heard from Natalie Palugyai, Secretary of the California Labor & Workforce Development Agency. Secretary Palugyai was appointed by Governor Newsom on July 14, 2021 and is the first Latina to serve as California Labor Secretary.





Last year, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors <u>launched the</u> <u>establishment of the Economic and Workforce Development Department</u>, and recently the name was changed to the Department of Economic Opportunity. The goal of the reorganization is to combine economic development with workforce development efforts thereby creating economies of scale and more collaborative and unified programming and services for the county.

Furthermore, the county also <u>announced a new Executive Director of Economic and Workforce Development</u>, <u>Kelly LoBianco</u>.
