Northern California

The Good Chocolate - Manufacturing 100% Organic Bean-To-Bar Chocolate



Owners Ben and Miki embarked on a journey determined to eliminate sugar from their diet. Along the way they learned a lot about the science of sugar and became aware that most food companies use sugar to keep us hooked on their products regardless of sugar's well-known negative effects. They decided to do something about it and The Good Chocolate was born. The San Francisco Chocolate Company produces delicious ZERO SUGAR bean-to-bar chocolate for people leading a healthy lifestyle and seeking the freedom to indulge.

Ben and Miki worked with the San Fransico SBDC to improve customer engagement and online sales. From the assistance received The Good Chocolate increased the open rate of their welcome email from 18.4% to 45.3% and improved the click-through rate from 1.6% to 7.1%. Increased eCommerce sales by 136.9%. Also improved their eCommerce conversion rate by 137.2%.
